FROM THE PASTORS DESK

What is a Priest?

Dear Brothers and Sisters of St. Anthony’s,

I hope you have been enjoying this time that we call “Ordinary” in the Church. I certainly have. In the Divine Office, which are the prayers that a priest promises to pray the rest of his life, for the good of the Church, we have been reading the book of Deuteronomy. Deuteronomy is one of the five books of the Law that is in the Old Testament. It was presumed that Moses wrote them, but modern scholarship has another theory which I can’t go into now; nor would you be interested. We will leave that to the biblical scholars.

In the section I am reading it talks about the ancient roots of what we today now call the “Priesthood.” Back in those days, the main function of the priest was to offer sacrifice. A sacrificial offering was offered to God for a variety of reasons. Sometimes for honoring the God-Head, sometimes in a spirit of thanksgiving for gifts received from the goodness of God. However, most of the time sacrifices were offered for atonement. In fact, the most sacred and holy day on the Jewish calendar still remains Yom Kippur, or the day atonement. This day was always a holiday for public school kids like me.

Of the twelve tribes of Israel, the tribe of Levi was designated the priestly tribe. From that tribe all the Old Testament priests were derived. They were afforded certain privileges and were set apart. The groundwork for the priesthood of Jesus Christ was being laid years before Jesus appeared on the scene.

Today, there is only one Priest, namely Jesus Christ. The letter to the Hebrews make this clear (Hebrews 8:1-3). This means that any concept of Priest must be derived from Jesus. I, as Fr. Stack, derive my priesthood from Jesus. He is “THE PRIEST”, and I simply share in Jesus’ priestly office according to my limited abilities.

All this is recounted very well in the Second Vatican councils document of the Sacred Liturgy. Here I quote Sacrosanctum Concilium # 7-8.

“Christ is always present to his Church, especially in the actions of the liturgy. He is present in the sacrifice of the Mass in the person of the minister. It is the same Christ who formerly offered himself on the cross that now offers by the ministry of priests and most of all under the Eucharistic species. He is present in the sacrament by his power, on such a way that when someone baptizes, Christ himself baptizes. He is present in the Word, for it is he himself who speaks when the holy Scriptures are read in Church. Finally, he is present when the Church prays and sings, for he himself promised: where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there in their midst.”

In conclusion, pray for your priests. They are the Ambassadors of Christ; it is as if God were appealing to his people through the priest. The priest is another Christ. I know that priests come in a variety of talents, gifts, abilities and personalities, but the fact remains, in the end **THEY ARE PRIESTS.**

FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME **FEBRUARY 4TH, 2018**

First Reading: Job 7:1-4, 6-7

In this passage, Job laments the drudgery and pain all people sometimes experience in life. He talks of troubled days and restless nights. But he does mention that the days move along swiftly, which can remind us that our time here on earth is quite limited and should be well spent.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 9:16-19,22-23

Paul explains to the Corinthians that he has no choice, but must preach the gospel. He tells of making himself all things to all people, in order to save some of them. He reminds them that he does this willingly, in the hope of sharing in the blessings of the gospel.

Gospel: Mark 1:29-39

Jesus cured Simon and Andrew's mother of a fever, then others with illnesses or demons came to see him. He cured those who were ill, and cast out the demons of the others. Then he went off and prayed alone until his followers sought him out. Jesus and his disciples then moved.
